

<p>The FAIRTRADE Mark means that farmers get paid a better price for the products they grow.</p> <p>Look for the label in your house. Can you find it on any clothes? How about food in the kitchen?</p>	<p>Check your drawers to see if there are any items of clothing that you do not need or fit anymore. Ask a grown up before you begin.</p> <p>Put these clothes in a bag to give to a family, friend or take to the charity shop. The clothes will be reused. It means that the clothes will be worn again!</p>	<p>Recycling your clothes means you can make them into something else!</p> <p>Use an old sock, t-shirt or pillow case to make a costume, new piece of clothing or toy.</p> 
<p>Imagine you are a fashion designer.</p> <p>Use pencils or pens to design an outfit made of Fairtrade cotton.</p> <p>Remember to include the FAIRTRADE Mark on the clothes labels.</p>		<p>It is important to take care of the clothes that we own. We wash our clothes to keep them clean. We fold clothes or hang them up in a wardrobe so they don't get crumpled. We pair socks so they don't get lost.</p> <p>Help a grown up next time they are doing the laundry. Learn how to fold a t-shirt, pair socks together and organise a clothes drawer.</p>

Can you find the country on a map?</p> <p>Use a computer or non-fiction book to find out what other products grow in India.</p>	<p>Cotton is a plant that grows from a seed. It grows in warm countries. Cotton does not grow in the UK but there are many other plants you can grow.</p> <p>With an adult, plant a seed in the garden or in a pot at home. What type of plant did you choose to grow?</p>
